




## Sufficiency Economy and Rural Development

## Climate Change Adaptation







4. have a good command of written and spoken English (courses will be conducted in English);
5. be in good physical and mental health.

## Allowances and Expenses

The Royal Thai Government will support tuition fees as well as allowances and other expenses, including international travel and accommodation costs throughout the postgraduate programmes.

## Application Procedures

1. Interested applicants must be nominated by their respective governments to the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in their respective countries before the application closing date.
2. The selection process will be done by the Royal Thai Government and academic institutions. The final decision will be made by the academic institution.
3. The Royal Thai Government will inform the nominating government (or relevant authority) of its decision on the nominee(s), four weeks before the course starts.

### Annual International Training Courses (AITC)

Realising the significant role of Human Resources Development in a country's economic and social development, the Royal Thai Government places great importance towards forging cooperation through "South-South Cooperation activities" with other developing countries, particularly through short-term training programmes under the Annual International Training Courses (AITC).

Fully supported by the Royal Thai Government, TICA is the main agency in charge of developing a wide range of training programmes under AITC. The AITC is organised annually with fellowships awarded by the Royal Thai Government from over 50 countries, including candidates from Thailand's neighbouring countries, as well as other developing countries in Asia and the Pacific, the Middle East, Africa, Central America and Latin America. Most AITC training courses are comprised of in-class lectures and discussions, field trips and hands-on workshops.

At present, the programme offers a wide range of development areas identified as urgent global issues in various sectors, such as sustainable development, sufficiency economy and rural development, agriculture and food security, climate change adaptation, public health and education.






### TICA at a glance

In 2002, Thailand boldly declared itself a graduate as a provider of Official Development Assistance (ODA). TICA is the main agency responsible for the implementation of Thailand's development cooperation programmes with neighbouring countries in particular as well as other regions of the world.


